The goal of the Graduate Climate Conference (GCC), created by graduate students at the University of Washington, is to provide a discussion forum for graduate students undertaking research on climate and climate change in an array of disciplines, including atmospheric, biological, earth and ocean sciences. Precise session topics will be chosen according to the interest of the applicant pool.

The format of the GCC is designed to encourage new climate scientists to become acquainted with the details of diverse areas of climate research and to place their own research in the broader context of the climate science community. There will be a combination of oral and poster presentations. Food, lodging, and conference costs will be provided by our generous sponsors. Travel funding will be available to students on an as-needed basis.
